Terrorist Threat Festive Seasons

Terrorist Threat Against Festive Seasons

Overseas experiences indicate that terrorists have a track record of targeting festive activities with symbolic significance or mass participation to maximise casualties, capture media attention and create fear amongst the public.

In the run-up to and during the holidays, citizens should remain vigilant and take precautions against terrorist or violent attacks, whether in Hong Kong or elsewhere.

Why are Festive Seasons Prone to Attacks?

Symbolic Reason

The symbolism of attacks on special festive seasons, specific targets or individuals may attract various followers of extremist ideologies.

Vulnerable to Attack

Festive events are often held at soft targets with low security and attended by large crowds who are often distracted by celebration activities and not on alert for danger.

Spreading Extremist Ideologies

Terrorist groups have from time to time encouraged their followers to carry out attacks at festive seasons to target large crowds and soft targets. Online propaganda or past attacks may inspire extremists to take action.

Overseas Cases

France

In July 2016, a 19-tonne cargo truck was deliberately driven into crowds of people celebrating Bastille Day in Nice, resulting in 86 deaths and

458 injuries.

Turkey



In January 2017,
a gunman opened fire at
a nightclub in Istanbul,
killing 39 people and
injuring 79 others, who
were celebrating New
Year's Day.


Sri Lanka



In April 2019,
a group of Islamist suicide
bombers attacked a
number of churches and
hotels in Colombo on
Easter Sunday, resulting
in 269 deaths and
at least 500
injuries.

The US

In November 2021,
a man plowed a vehicle
into the annual Christmas
parade in Wisconsin,
resulting in 6 deaths
and 62 injuries.





Terrorist Threat Level

The current Terrorist Threat Level of Hong Kong is "Moderate"

which means that there is the possibility of an attack but there is no specific intelligence suggesting that Hong Kong is likely to be a target.

Emergency Response

However, we should always stay alert. In the event of a terrorist incident, you should apply the advisory of "Run, Hide, Report" to stay safe.
